Director of Professional Development, Board of Directors, International Coach Federation in the UK:

Served in this capacity on UK Board pro-bono for 3 years from 2006 – 2008. In this role was responsible for creating, designing all aspects, implementing and collating outcomes of the Professional Development programme for 1000 coaches in UK. A further responsibility was to generate enough income from these webinars, F2F events and conferences to enable the UK ICF to be able to operate effectively and with impact in the profession. A professional approach to CPD was implemented by shifting the standard of content and presenter to an exceptionally high level. Recognition for the provision of an outstanding 3 years' of Continuous Professional Development programmes was acknowledged both nationally and internationally.

South & West organiser of Hot Coaching Topics day conferences:

Created opportunities for conversations to take place between coaches, internal and external, buyers of coaching corporate and SMEs, those from organisations interested in finding out about coaching, coach training organisations, coaching organisations on the current hot coaching topics. The conversation place not marketplace context enabled the coaching conversation to emerge and evolve in partnership. These conferences ran from 2006 through till 2012.

Member of ICF Global Conference Sub-committee for 2008 conference Montreal:

Worked with team of 4 colleagues to design the 7 sessions of the Impact on the World programme track, engage and brief the presenters, ensure the smooth running of the track within the context of the whole conference. The track was offered for the first time in 2008 and proved a significant success evidenced by the participant numbers for each session.

Co-ordinator of BWB – Bristol Women in Business:

A network for corporate women and women working in large businesses in Bristol. Started as an initiative called Project You launched by a partnership of UWE and Lloyds Banking Group in 2014. Surprised to discover responsibility for taking the initiative forward ... action was swung into! Eleven events were run in 2014 and 2015 sponsored by generous corporates around the city of Bristol with a rich mix of events and presenters. 2016 saw the change of name to BWB, a Steering Group, 8 events and the call for commitment from those who wish to be BWB members. The Steering Group has enabled the network to develop and grow by using different ideas, social media and technological expertise. 2019 was the end of BWB's iteration creating space for something new to emerge.
